
wine garden! Remember to bring your ID as it will be required to purchase beer or wine. The event also includes a free concert by "The Mousam River Rats".



Summer reading is not just for kids! Think constellations, the occult, and stars —and aliens! Our community read in July will be H. G. Wells' *War of the Worlds*—the 1898 classic sci-fi novel that presents itself as a factual account of the Martian invasion, spawning feature films, radio dramas, various comic book adaptations, television series, and sequels by other authors. It has even influenced the work of scientists, notably Robert Hutchings Goddard.


