
In 2018, we introduced our new mission statement: To inspire and enable our communities to discover, learn, and connect. A big part of fulfilling that mission has been getting books into your hands. (Nothing makes a librarian happier than seeing someone walk out the door with a giant stack of books.) It's also been watching people get to know each other over books, or storytimes, or puzzles, or sitting in front of the fire. It's been helping people learn to use their new laptops or making computers available to those who need them. Sometimes, it's been just being there to talk to somebody who was having a rough day.

Though we cannot physically be in the library right now, we are still here. Staff is working hard every day to find creative ways to continue to fulfill our mission. While we are closed, you can still:

- Talk to us. Staff is working from home and available to answer e-mails. We are also checking the library voicemail daily. You can call us with reference questions or just because you are tired of being trapped in your house and want somebody to talk to. Leave us a message and we will call you back.
- Check out books through OverDrive or CloudLibrary (adults, teens & kids).
- Use our databases. While we are closed, Ancestry Library edition will be available from home, thanks to a deal worked out by the Maine State Library.
- Get a new library card or renew your existing card.
- Use our wi-fi. It is accessible 24-7 on our lawn and in the parking lot. (We encourage you to stay in your car or practice social distancing.)
- Attend library programs, including storytime, trivia, and book groups.

Below, you will find answers to your questions about checked-out items and library cards; information about programs and services that we're offering; ideas for fun things to do at home; and messages from some staff members about their experiences over the last few weeks. We are still working on adding new programs so be sure to keep an eye on our website, social media, and the programming message on our phone. Website updates will be in the "While We're Closed" tab and the rotating display.

We miss you. We miss the library. We know you do too. We are hoping that the proactive steps that the community and the state have taken to slow the spread of the virus mean that we will be able to safely reopen soon. In the meantime, we will keep working. We would love to hear your thoughts about what else we can do to help our community through this.



FAQ

Hi everyone, it's Brittany, the Circulation Services Manager! We've been hearing a lot from you about when your books are going to be due, how you can renew your library card, or how you can sign up for a library card if you didn't have one before. Here are answers to some of those common questions, but always feel free to reach out to us!

How do I get a library card if I don't already have one?

Just email the library at kflcirc@kennebunk.lib.me.us, and we can get you set up with a temporary card so you can access our digital collections. Once we reopen, you will need to come to the library and provide photo ID and proof of address. We can then give you your physical library card as well.

How do I renew my library card if it's expired?

All library cards that were set to expire in March or April have been extended until June 1st. If your card had expired prior to then, email either the library at kflcirc@kennebunk.lib.me.us, or call us at (207) 985-2173 and we can renew it for you.

What's going to happen with overdue fines?

All due dates on Kennebunk Free Library items have been automatically extended until May 1st.

Due dates for most other libraries were also extended, however please feel free to reach out if you're getting notices about a book coming up due or overdue. We will be waiving all new overdue fines accrued through the end of April. Fees for lost or damaged items will still apply. If the closure goes beyond May 1, due dates and fine amnesty will be extended.

Can I return items in the book drop?

Yes, the book drop will be available, however we would strongly appreciate it if you would consider holding onto anything you have checked out until we reopen. We will be waiving all new overdue fines accrued through the end of April.

What's going to happen to my holds?

Any items that you currently have on the holdshelf at KFL will still be there; we won't be sending anything back for awhile after we reopen, so don't worry about those being cancelled! Any requests that are currently on your account will sit there, and you won't lose your place in any waitlists. We will not be sending or receiving any interlibrary loans during this closure.

Digital Collections

Looking for something to read during our building's closure? Have a computer, smartphone, Kindle Fire or iPad? Great! You can access eBooks and audiobooks through our two digital platforms! All you need is your library card.

CloudLibrary is a platform for eBooks and audiobooks that is administered at the state level and is accessible to all public library patrons in the state of Maine. To meet increased demand, more titles are currently being added to this platform. See <https://www.yourcloudlibrary.com/> to get started.

Overdrive/Libby is also a platform for eBooks and audiobooks, but is run by your KFL librarians and is accessible only to Kennebunk Free Library cardholders. While this platform has fewer titles to choose from, wait times for holds are shorter than on CloudLibrary. We are also adding more titles to expand our offerings and selections for you.
