Although glue is allowed, try string, thread or raffia to connect pieces, or make glue using flour and water. If "building materials" are needed to construct your Faerie Home, the Seacoast Garden Club will supply a selection of pine cones, bark and sea shells available to be picked up in the Children's Room.

■ World Book Night is an annual celebration of reading and books which sees tens of thousands of people share books with others in their communities to spread the joy and love of reading. Successfully launched in the U.K. in 2011, World Book Night is also now celebrated in the U.S. World Book Night, promoted through social media and traditional publicity, will give out free paperbacks on April 23, 2012. The purpose of WBN is to engage those who are not keen readers or who don't readily have access to books. WBN also promotes the value of reading, of printed books, and of bookstores and libraries to everyone year-round.

Why April 23rd? The day is the UNESCO International Day of the Book, chosen in honor of Shakespeare and Cervantes, who both died on April 23, 1616, as well as the anniversary of Shakespeare's birth.

The chapter was approved by WBN to distribute books nationally, since chapter members live in different locations. 
