

Throughout history, poems have been stowed in pockets in a variety of ways, from the commonplace books of the Renaissance to the pocket-sized publications for Army soldiers in World War II. In 2002, the Office of the Mayor, in partnership with the NYC Dept. of Cultural Affairs and Education, initiated *Poem in Your Pocket Day* (PIYP) as part of the city's National Poetry Month celebration.

In 2008, the Academy of American Poets took the initiative national, encouraging individuals around the country to join in and channel their inner bard. Each year on Poem in Your Pocket Day, schools, bookstores, libraries, parks, workplaces, and other venues ring loud with open readings of poems from pockets.

# **Speers Artists for April: Kennebunk** Homeschoolers


An exhibit by Kennebunk Homeschoolers Network will be on display in the Speers Gallery


