


#### Cook and Share Cookbook Club - April 3

### Printmaking Discussion - April 8

Artist Brian Cohen will be at the Kennebunk Free Library on **Tuesday, April 8, 2025 at 6:00 p.m.** to discuss his 40-year career as a printmaker. He says "I began to make prints because I had to; a printmaking course was part of the curriculum of an art program where I was hired to teach...To learn more, I began to make my own etchings and soon fell in love with the medium. I learned from books and from gaps in my knowledge that showed up in my early etchings and in my

own teaching. The craft, history, and look of etching grew on me....Now I look at my work and reflect with some satisfaction that I continued to make art throughout my entire life, and I continue to make art now. I would like my work to be seen."

Brian D. Cohen is an educator, printmaker and painter. He founded Bridge Press in 1989 to further the association and integration of visual image, original text, and book structure. Artist's books and prints by Brian D. Cohen have been shown in over forty individual exhibitions, including a retrospective at the Fresno Art Museum, and in over 200 group shows. Cohen's books and etchings are held by major private and public collections throughout the country. He lives in Kennebunk and is an avid collector of books and prints, rides motorcycles, and plays classical viola.

Author Terece Horton will be at the Kennebunk Free Library on **Monday, April 14, 2025 at 6:00 p.m.** to discuss her book *Rebecca's Gift*.

"On May 28, 1994, my life was shattered. A drunk driver crashed into the car carrying my family. In one moment, my ex-husband, Doug, his new wife, Robin, and my 11 year-old daughter, Rebecca, were killed. My nine-year-old son Oliver was trapped in the car with serious injuries. This is my story of grief and healing, and how I found strength and courage, faith, and trust, and ultimately the power of Love."

Terece Horton has been involved in the field of holistic health for more than 40 years. After her own personal tragedy, writing "Rebecca's Gift, her first book, has been part of her healing journey. A longtime resident of Cape Cod, Massachusetts, Terece now lives - still close to the ocean - in Wells, Maine.



### Fiction Book Discussion - April 22

Join us on **Tuesday, April 22 at 1:00 p.m.** to discuss *Olga Dies Dreaming* by Xóchitl González.

"Gonzalez's edifying debut follows a successful Puerto Rican Brooklynite with family baggage that increasingly disrupts her life. Olga, 40, a wedding planner and frequent guest on morning TV shows, rubs shoulders—and sometimes more—with her wealthy, powerful clients. Her older brother, Prieto, who is secretly gay, has risen through the local political ranks to become a U.S. congressman who represents their Sunset Park neighborhood. The siblings' beloved



papí, once a charismatic activist for Puerto Rican independence, fell into heroin addiction and died when Olga was still a teen, and their mamí remained true to the cause, leaving her children to work with a covert paramilitary group. Olga does not know, but Prieto has been the victim of blackmail for years by a couple of real estate moguls with whom she is acquainted, who've made a killing off their Puerto Rican community in Brooklyn. Details about their papí's life and tragic death, as well as his blackmailers' sinister intentions in Puerto Rico, add poignancy to Prieto's troubles, and each sibling faces a crisis of conscience when Hurricane Maria hits and their mamí issues a dubious ultimatum. The expository dialogue often feels stilted, but the characters' yearning to see the island thrive adds passion and complexity. Gonzalez elevates this family drama with a great deal of insight on the characters' diaspora and politics." –Publishers Weekly


Cribbage and Carbs - Thursdays Beginning March 27 (NEW WEEKLY GROUP)



### **April Artist: Laura Dauphinais**

The Speers Gallery at the Kennebunk Free Library presents "Near and Far in Black and White" by Laura Dauphinais. Laura's exhibit features black and white digital prints taken locally as well as in her travels beyond Maine. She has included select images from different countries, seasons and genres. Laura says, "I hope to demonstrate how monochrome images can cause a familiar scene to appear so much more striking and dramatic than some of their color counterparts and perhaps allow the audience to see details they may not have noticed otherwise. Shadows and empty black spaces seem to intensify the details of the main subject."

Although Laura has taken pictures her whole life, it has been in retirement that she has been able to focus on learning more about photography and do more experimenting with the hobby she loves. #### Hope: The Autobiography by Pope Francis

What were the experiences that lead to this humble man becoming Pope? Who are the people that mentored and taught Pope Francis? What does he want us to know about what he has learned, seen and helped form his beliefs? The story is told of his family's immigration from Italy to Buenos Aires, Argentina in 1929, growing up in his neighborhood, living through political

unrest in Argentina, his early priesthood and the days leading up to his election as Pope in November 2013. He shares his love of opera, books, poetry, humor, our environment and most of all, people and especially children. A timely read as Pope Francis struggles with his health and speaks out against injustice in our country. (Available from KFL as a book)

#### Grief is For People by Sloane Crosley

Each person's grief is unique, even different losses by the same person deviate. The author shares her journey coming from a very different mindset than my own which is faith based. I found her articulate description of her day-to-day survival following traumatic loss very helpful in helping to understand and support someone grieving. Losing a loved one to suicide is a complex life event and has many feelings and responses to the loss. This is a valuable memoir from a candid author that is good at sharing her experience. #### Cabin: off-the-grid adventures with a clueless craftsman by Patrick Hutchison

When I heard of this book's release, I knew I would be interested. It did not disappoint! A young man, feeling unanchored in his life, miserable in the job he got using his degree, adrift in the world, and decides to buy a tiny cabin in dismal condition in the wilds of the Pacific Northwest for \$7,500. With no skills, no tools, little money, and a dream he embarks on a journey of learning, tranquility, and growing into adulthood. I loved this "laugh out loud" feel-good read with relatable personalities, even the acknowledgments. (Available as a book from Minerva, audio from Libby read by the author)
