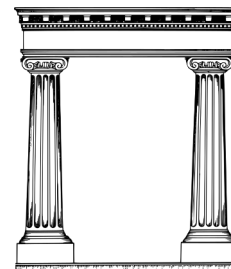
## Escape Room, Children's Edition - August 2

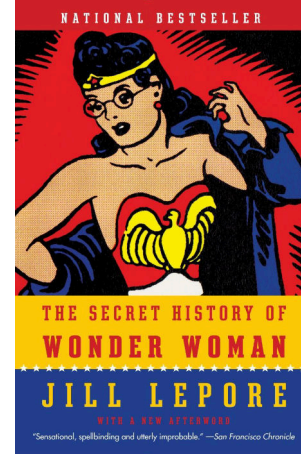

## Nonfiction Book Group - August 13

**Adult**

Join us on Monday, August 13 at 6:30 to discuss *The Secret History of Wonder Woman* by Jill Lepore:

"The surprising origins of a 20th-century goddess. Wonder Woman, writes Lepore (History/Harvard Univ.; Book of Ages: The Life and Opinions of Jane Franklin, 2013), "was the product of the suffragist, feminist, and birth control movements of the 1900s and 1910s and became a source of the women's liberation and feminist movements of the 1960s and 1970s." ... Wonder Woman burst into comics in 1941, the creation of William Moulton Marston, a Harvard-educated psychologist. Marston, a master at self-promotion, had failed as a college professor; colleagues scorned his publicity stunts. ... Among the many topics on which Marston expounded was women's power....The creation, publishing history and eventual demise of the cartoon character are only part of Lepore's story, which uncovers the secret of Marston's startlingly unconventional family. ... Lepore mines new archival sources to reconstruct Marston's tangled home life and the controversy generated by Wonder Woman. It's an irresistible story, and the author tells it with relish and delight.(Kirkus Reviews, August 15, 2014)"

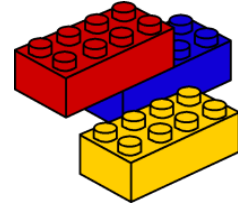

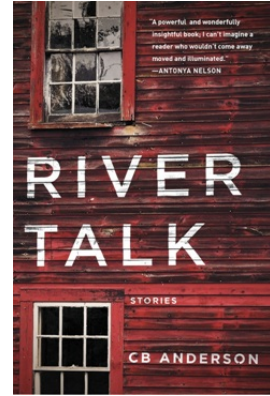


## Adult Book Discussion - August 28

## Library News & Events

### Elmina B. Sewall Charcoal Portrait Dedication

We will be hosting a portrait charcoal study dedication on Friday, August 3 at 2 p.m. The full-sized portrait is of Kennebunk philanthropist Elmina B. Sewall. It is the charcoal study of a piece commissioned by Mrs. Sewall's friend William Curran. The painter, Tony Falcone, worked from pictures and captured Mrs. Sewall in her mid-sixties when she created her Foundation. The Elmina B. Sewall Foundation supports work in Maine to improve the well-being of people, animals and the environment while fostering relationships that strive for social equity and community resilience.

*As a child, Elmina Brewster Sewall was given two piggy banks. Her weekly allowance was divided equally: half in a piggy bank designated for her own spending and half in a piggy bank marked "Charity". Thus began "Sis" Sewall's lifelong commitment to helping those in need. She long focused her volunteer and philanthropic efforts on animal welfare, land conservation, and issues affecting human well-being.*

*In 1996, Mrs. Sewall was named Citizen of the Year by the Chamber of Commerce in her hometown of Kennebunk, Maine. She stated then with typical humble grace: "I like to help people out...I like to do what I can." Through her personal giving as well as that of the Elmina B. Sewall Foundation, which she established in 1982, Mrs. Sewall has had a profound impact on life in Kennebunk and the State of Maine.*

*Since Mrs. Sewall's death in 2005, the Foundation's Board of Directors has sought to continue her philanthropic legacy. The Elmina B. Sewall Foundation makes grants in Maine in the following three areas of interest: Animal Welfare, Healthy People Healthy Places, and Legacy. [sewallfoundation.org](http://sewallfoundation.org).*

Kennebunk Free Library is an annual recipient of a Sewall legacy grant and is very proud to add this portrait to our main lobby. Please join us, donor William Curran, and artist Tony Falcone for
