## Newsletter News

Beginning January 1, 2013, KFL will begin publishing a **quarterly newsletter!** The 'new' newsletter format will include articles of interest about the library, authors, and other related topics and will include a preview of upcoming programs and events. Because we want to continue keeping you informed about what's happening at KFL, we will also publish a **monthly e-newsletter** that will provide event and program information. The KFL website also lists programs and events and is a great source of information, including our catalog.

We know that changes can present challenges; over 2500 years ago the Greek philosopher Heraclitus wrote "Change is the only constant." That statement was true then as well as today! Please let us know if you have ideas for articles, programs, titles to be added to the collection, or other suggestions on how we can best meet your cultural, informational, educational, and recreational needs. We hope this change will improve our communication.

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## Let's Talk About It!

KFL has been selected by the Maine Humanities Council to offer "Mirror of Maine: the Maine Community in Myth and Reality," a Let's Talk About It free reading and discussion group. The discussion will be facilitated by Patricia Parker, a former professor with a 30+ year career teaching in several colleges and universities.

The series begins January 3, 2013 at 1 PM in our Reference Room, and will continue for four monthly sessions. Books to be read and discussed include: Lura Beam's *A Maine Hamlet* (January 3), Ruth Moore's, *The Weir* (February 7), Joyce Butler's *Wildfire Loose: The Week Maine Burned* (March 7), and Richard Russo's *Empire Falls* (April 4).

" 'The Mirror of Maine' opens new doors to Maine's literature and its extraordinary history and culture. These books reveal aspects of life in our state can bring deeper knowledge and appreciation for what makes Maine a special place and for authors who express those ideas.... We are reminded how influential books have always been and how great stories provide an opportunity to discuss continuity and change in Maine life. Since most of these books are based on actual towns, readers can consider what is real and what is myth about Maine towns, their patterns of daily life, and the values held by the residents."—Maine Humanities Council

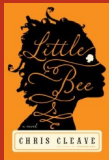

You may have noticed some commotion going on at the Library!

- Our chimney has been rebuilt from the roofline to its top, which will stop the ever-so-slight leak when it rains.
- A cement pad has been poured for our new book drop—the not-so-old book drop did not fare well after it was hit by a truck towing a trailer! The new book drop will be installed soon.
- Finally, our roof in the central part of the building is being repaired. After the nearly 15 years since our addition was built, the roof needed attention.

These projects, in addition to the restoration of our front columns earlier this year, are critical to continue our stewardship of this beautiful building on Main Street.

Choosing an E-reader for yourself or as a gift? Stop by in December to demo a Kindle and Nook® anytime to try them out. Staff will be on hand to help you get started. We also have them available anytime to borrow and try out at home or while traveling.

Our new copier has arrived, and with it the ability to print to it from your Smartphone, laptop or tablet. Many of our computer users are no longer using their costly printers and are using KFL's instead at a fraction of the cost. This new feature will allow you to send the document, photo, spreadsheet, etc., from home and print it here. Amazing!

In January, we will begin to lend laptop computers for use within the Library. Equipped with Windows 7, the Microsoft suite of programs, Skype and Open Office, laptops will be available on a first-come, first-serve basis, are subject to availability, and may not be reserved.
