Heart and Home Book Club - July 1



Nonfiction Book Group - July 8

Join us on Monday, July 8 at 6:30 p.m. to discuss *Endurance* by Scott Kelly.

Inspired by Tom Wolfe's book *The Right Stuff* (1979), Kelly became a navy pilot and astronaut. Before retiring from NASA, he earned the record for the most total time spent in space, including 340 consecutive days at the International Space Station. This memoir is filled with stories of the daring, patience, and humanity necessary to be an effective leader in space, along with the stress of being away from family. His brother Mark Kelly is also a retired astronaut; Scott tells of



hearing about the 2011 shooting of his sister-in-law U.S. congresswoman Gabrielle Giffords, from afar and subsequently leading a moment of silence in honor of the victims. While Kelly's story is personal, it's also a cautionary tale about the future of space exploration, especially if deeper investment is not made. VERDICT Kelly's down-to-earth personality, humor, and blog SteveKelly.com have earned him a devoted following. Highly recommended to anyone who has an interest in memoirs or space travel. (Library Journal, vol 142, issue 15, p 94)

History of the Apollo 11 Moon Landing - July 9

In honor of the 50th anniversary of the Apollo 11 moon landing, astronomer Scott Negley will be at the Kennebunk Free Library on Tuesday, July 9 at 6:00 to discuss the history behind that "one small step." Learn about the NASA programs that paved the way for the historic moment.



Scott Negley owns and operates a portable planetarium system for presenting astronomy programs to elementary and middle school classes in northern New England. Educated initially as an engineer, a binocular tour of the heavens ignited a passion for the stars that led him to the University of Pennsylvania for a M.S. degree in astronomy and a 40+-year career as an astronomy educator. He has been privileged to convey the splendor of the universe to students of all ages, initially as a university instructor, then as a school district planetarium director, adult school teacher and elderhostel instructor. As a Solar System Ambassador, Scott enjoys the opportunity to educate and inspire others with NASA's magnificent discoveries.

To the Ends of the Earth - July 10 & 31

Because our Summer Reading Theme is "A Universe of Stories," many of this summer's programs involve space or space travel. However, there are plenty of wide open spaces to explore right here on Earth. On Wednesday, July 10 at 6:00, Kathleen Nolan will be at KFL to share photos and stories about her adventures in Antarctica. On

Wednesday, July 31, Nolan will return to talk about about her excursion to the high arctic.

Kathleen Nolan is a retired teacher who has traveled to Europe more than 50 times, the Arctic, Antarctic, South America, six countries in Africa, Nepal, Mongolia, China, and Tibet.

Astrophotographer Mike Taylor - July 16

Astrophotographer Mike Taylor will be here on Tuesday, July 16 at 6:00. Using slides, graphics, and examples of his work, he will discuss why he

loves night photography, what got him into it, and how it differs so much from any other kind of photography. He will explain how Astrophotography is different from Landscape Astrophotography, where the Milky Way is in the sky, how it moves through the night and through the seasons, etc. He will also talk about how to track the Northern Lights, how to know when there will be a display, and how they look at Maine's latitude compared to places like Iceland, Norway, etc. Taylor will show slides of raw images next to processed images and explain a little bit about processing night photos and the logistics and equipment involved in capturing and processing time lapse footage.



Maine's German POW Camps During WWII - July 22

Between 1944 and 1946, more than 4,000 German prisoners of war called Maine home. The story of how they arrived, and the lasting impact that they had on the people who encountered them is one of Maine's most interesting and obscure stories. Join us on Monday, July 22 at 6:00 p.m. as Holocaust and Human Rights Center




of Maine Program Director David Greenham shares the lively and surprising story of an interesting chapter of Maine history, using materials and research used to create the 2012 exhibit "Maine Boys Overseas and German Boys in Maine." It is a story of cooperation, kindness, and enemies who found a way to work for a common good, and even became friends.

Adult Book Discussion - July 23

Join us on Tuesday, July 23 at 1:00 p.m. to discuss Little Fires Everywhere by Celeste Ng.

Shaker Heights, Ohio, is a by-the-books kind of town. Longtime residents know the well-established rules of conduct. Newcomers, such as itinerant artist Mia Warren and her teenage daughter, Pearl, must find out for themselves what is acceptable and what is not. Renting an apartment from city-native Elena Richardson should give Mia and Pearl a leg up. Instead, it throws them into the midst of a fraught custody battle concerning a Chinese American baby; engenders fierce rivalries between brothers Moody and Trip Richardson



for Pearl's attention; and casts Mia as the unlikely confidant of the Richardson daughters, popular Lexie and outcast Izzy. There are secrets upon secrets within the families: Mia's past is hidden from Pearl, just as Pearl conceals her love affair with Trip. Lexie's abortion must be kept from her family, while only Izzy knows the subterfuge her mother is using to undermine Mia and Pearl's happiness. Ng's stunning second novel is a multilayered examination of how identities are forged and maintained, how families are formed and friendships tested, and how the notion of motherhood is far more fluid than bloodlines would suggest. Ng's debut, Everything I Never Told You (2015), was a book -group staple. Laden with themes of loyalty and betrayal, honesty and trust, her latest tour de force should prove no less popular. (Booklist, vol 113, number 21, p19)

This summer, Kennebunk Free Library patrons will have the opportunity to be part of a statewide community read. Each year, the Maine Humanities Council asks a popular Maine author to recommend two books. This year, author Tess Gerritsen has selected *Paris was the Place* by Susan Conley and *After the Eclipse* by Sarah Perry.

Join KFL staff to discuss *Paris was the Place* on Tuesday, July 23 at 6:00 p.m. On Tuesday, August 20 at 6:00, we will be discussing *After the Eclipse*. Call or stop by the library to reserve your copies of the books.



You can also join the conversation with people around the state. Maine Humanities Council is hosting a Read ME Facebook group that all are invited to join. The discussion series will wrap up with an episode of Maine Calling broadcast live from Bangor Public Library.

21-Day Journaling Challenge - July 24

This summer, the Kennebunk Free Library will host a 21-Day Journaling Challenge! This is a two-part program, and registration is required. - Thursday, August 15 11:30-12:30: Pony bead aliens (for ages 7 and up)




Pet Show - July 22

Since artists spend so much time working alone, the group values the opportunity to exchange ideas, offer support, and socialize. "The Kitchen Table Band" practices at the same time - perhaps the live music invigorates the paintings.

"Open Studio Painters" use varied media, but mostly work in pastels and watercolor. Mary Barrett uses pastels to depict people at work or play.
