Minerva/MaineCat Requesting Update

As we discussed last month, the interruption in interlibrary loans this summer was the result of a vendor that was not selected to be the courier for Maine's ILL system appealing the decision. The appeal hearing has happened and legally, a decision has to be returned by July 9 at the latest.

There are two ways this can go. The decision to award the contract to the selected vendor can be upheld. In that case, the new vendor would need time to get the service up and running - probably a few weeks. The other possibility is that the decision will not be upheld and the State Library would need to start from scratch in finding a new vendor. The selected vendor was chosen by the State Library will a lot of care and consideration. I am optimistic that the decision will be upheld.

More information and potential work-arounds are available on our website. The Maine State Library has an FAQ page that they are updating as new information becomes available. It is available here.

We are grateful for the patience, support, and kindness that you have shown staff this month. We are just as frustrated as you are with the situation and are looking forward to getting back to normal! 


Life Sized Candy Land for Adults - July 2

Die Well Death Education - July 22

Join us at Kennebunk Free Library on Monday, July 22, 2024 from 6:00 - 7:30 p.m. for the third session in the Die Well Death Education Series with host Leona Oceania. You are welcome to attend one or all of the sessions - no registration is required.

Session two is a film: Barbara Karnes's *This is How People Die – Part Two: Labor of Dying. This is How People Die* addresses the normal dying process, from months before death through the actual moment of death. This film provides

the knowledge and tools for working with the end of life, presented with non-medical terminology. It is a practical guide for working with anyone facing end-of-life issues. Part Two will cover: labor of dying: pain, fear, unfinished business, religion, family dynamics, social masks, one to three weeks before death, days to hours before death, hours to minutes before death, what to say, near death experiences, etc. (56 minutes) Open discussion to follow as time allows.

Barbara Karnes, RN, is an internationally respected speaker, educator, author, and thought leader on matters of end of life. She is a renowned authority on the dying process and a leading educator for families, healthcare professionals, and the community at large. Barbara's award-winning DVDs and books about death and dying are changing lives - in this country and around the world. In her work, Barbara compassionately explains stages of the dying process, living with a life-threatening illness, pain management, and how people grieve.

She explains how important it is to take care of yourself as a caregiver and offers guidelines for professionals.

Barbara has dedicated the last 40 years of her life to the education, care, and support of dying people and their loved ones. The most useful and important things that she's learned along the way have been distilled into her materials.


Each performance is a celebration of the joy of working across cultures with bandmates you may not even share a language in common with. And the night is never complete without some audience participation!

Fiction Book Discussion - July 23

Join us on Tuesday, July 23 at 1:00 p.m. to discuss *Tomorrow, and Tomorrow, and Tomorrow* by Gabrielle Zevin. Because of the current interruption in interlibrary loan services, KFL will have limited copies to borrow.

"Zevin (Young Jane Young) returns with an exhilarating epic of friendship, grief, and computer game development. In 1986, Sadie



Green, 11, visits a children's hospital where her sister is recovering from cancer. There, she befriends another patient, a 12-year-old Korean Jewish boy named Sam Masur, who has a badly injured foot, and the two bond over their love for video games. Their friendship ruptures, however, after Sam discovers Sadie's been tallying the visits to fulfill her bat mitzvah service. Years later, they reconnect while attending college in Boston. Sam is wowed by a game Sadie developed, called Solution. In it, a player who doesn't ask questions will unknowingly build a widget for the Third Reich, thus forcing the player to reflect on the impact of their moral choices. He proposes they design a game together, and relying on help from his charming, wealthy Japanese Korean roommate, Marx, and Sadie's instructor cum abusive lover, Dov, they score a massive hit with Ichigo, inspired by The Tempest. In 2004, their virtual world-builder Mapletown allows

for same-sex marriages, drawing ire from conservatives, and a violent turn upends everything for Sam and Sadie. Zevin layers the narrative with her characters' wrenching emotional wounds as their relationships wax and wane, including Sadie's resentment about sexism in gaming, Sam's loss of his mother, and his foot amputation. Even more impressive are the visionary and transgressive games (another, a shooter, is based on the poems of Emily Dickinson). This is a one-of-a-kind achievement." – Publisher's Weekly



The Eastern Coyote in New England - July 29

On Monday, July 29 at 6:00 p.m., Chris Schadler of Project Coyote will be at KFL to discuss this fascinating species.

An eastern coyote is defined as much by its western coyote ancestry as by its DNA contribution from the Eastern wolf. "Our" coyotes vary physically and behaviorally from its smaller relative – while still carrying the incredible adaptability and canniness of

Wile E. Coyote. This program takes a deep dive into the ecology and behavior of this creature, its indefatigability and how it is the human who must adapt to live with the 'One Who Cannot Be Removed'.

On the horizon, however, is a native carnivore which fled the northeast during wolf removal and now may be trying to return: The eastern wolf. A look-alike to the coyote, it has been killed mistakenly for its similarity of appearance to the coyote. We'll talk about how the wolf and coyote might negotiate a truce in the northeast and how we might do the same.

Chris' interest in wild canids began in the 1970s as a volunteer at the Wolf Park in Battleground, Indiana. This opportunity and others inspired an eventual Masters in Conservation Biology at Antioch University in Keene. Her thesis focused on the Natural Recovery of the Eastern Timber Wolf in Michigan. Chris lived in Michigan and Minnesota during the early 1980s where her research into the gray wolf continued and her speaking career began.

Beginning in the early 1990s, Chris taught Forestry, Wolf Ecology and Environmental Conservation in the Natural Resources Department at UNH, receiving many teaching excellence awards. She also instructed and mentored adult degree candidates in the UNH System at Granite State College.

While wolf recovery was the focus of her early work, Chris' attention shifted to the Eastern Coyote when she and her flock of sheep moved to New England. She is now the NH and VT Representative for Project Coyote, a national organization promoting coexistence with coyotes. Chris co-founded the NH Wildlife Coalition, is a founding member of the North East Wolf Recovery Alliance and also Chairs the Webster Conservation Commission.




