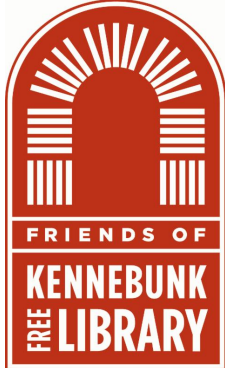

### Coming soon to the Children's collection: Yoto players and cards!

We're making an exciting addition to the children's audio collection! Yoto players provide a new way to listen to audiobooks. Instead of a disc, the audio recording comes preloaded on a card. To listen, insert the card into the player and you're good to go! KFL is adding 2 Yoto players for checkout. Each player comes with a selection of Yoto cards, a charging cord, and instruction guide. We'll also be

circulating Yoto cards on their own, so if you have your own Yoto player, you can borrow our cards just like you would borrow an audiobook! Don't have a Yoto player? 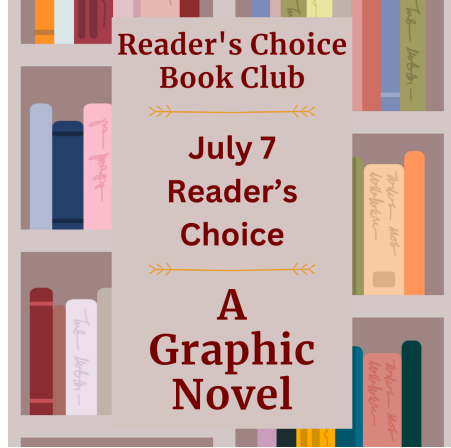


### Monthly Phone Wallpaper

### The Just History Project: Uncovering Forgotten Local History - July 9

Did you know that the purchase of the first enslaved person in Arundel (today's Kennebunkport) was paid for by the Town?





Did you know that Lucy Nicolar, a Penobscot, who spent her summers in her youth at the “Indian Encampment” along the Kennebunk River, became a nationally known singer and recording artist, and was instrumental in gaining suffrage for the Wabanaki people of Maine?

Did you know that Shepard Bourn of Kennebunk, the son of the formerly enslaved man Salem Bourne, was impressed by the British Navy at the onset of the War of 1812 and sent to a prison ship at the Rock of Gibraltar?

**On Wednesday, July 9 at 6:30 p.m.**, the Kennebunk Free Library is pleased to host an introduction to the new Just History Project that uncovers and highlights the largely forgotten history of Black, Wabanaki, and People of Color who once lived in what are now the towns of Wells, Kennebunk, Kennebunkport and Arundel. It also highlights the history of the local white settlers who were connected to them as enslavers or in other capacities.

Over the last five years, Bill Grabin has identified and researched over 300 individuals, and created an online database that details what is known about these individuals, incorporating as many primary source documents as possible. The Just History **Database** can be found on the Brick Store Museum’s website at [www.brickstoremuseum.org/justhistory](http://www.brickstoremuseum.org/justhistory). The database is filled with fascinating tales, and this program will highlight a number of them. The website is designed to be an educational resource for students, researchers, and community members alike. The program will demonstrate how the database can be easily navigated.

Bill Grabin has lived in Kennebunk with his wife Monica since 1985, and for many years has been a member of a number of conservation and historical organizations. He was a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania, and co-founded Renaissance Greeting Cards. He served as President of the Kennebunk Land Trust, and continues to serve as President of York County Audubon. He has long been fascinated by history and genealogical research.



## **From Sputnik to Space X, A History of Space Exploration - July 14**

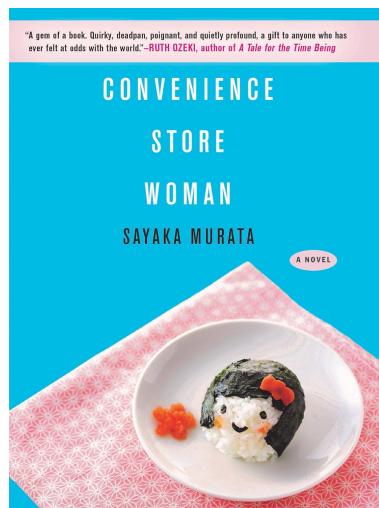
On **Monday, July 14 at 6 p.m.**, join us at Kennebunk Free Library to learn about the history of space exploration from Sputnik to Space X. Presenter Yuri Freeman will take us through the first Russian Space missions, including Sputnik, the first artificial satellite, and the launch of Yuri Gagarin, the first human in space. He will then cover the American Space missions that culminated with Neil Armstrong and Edwin (Buzz) Aldrin becoming the first humans to walk on the moon; the American astronauts and Russian cosmonauts meeting in space during the Apollo-Soyuz missions; and modern Space X breakthroughs, including reusable rockets, and Starlink global internet. Freeman will also discuss his career in space electronics.

Yuri Freeman has a Ph.D. in solid state physics, the foundation of modern electronics and 62 U.S. and international patents. In his career as a scientist and engineer, Freeman developed the most advanced Tantalum capacitors, the key parts of life-saving cardio implants and space systems. For this work, Freeman received the Ekeberg Prize, the highest award in this field of applied science and engineering. Freeman participated in the Russian space program and then was invited to the United States by Sprague Electric in Sanford, Maine, where he got involved in the U.S. space program.

## Fiction Book Discussion - July 22

Join us on **Tuesday, July 22 at 1 p.m.** to discuss *Convenience Store Woman* by Sayaka Murata.

"Murata's slim and stunning Akutagawa Prize-winning novel follows 36-year-old Keiko Furukura, who has been working at the same convenience store for the last 18 years, outlasting eight managers and countless customers and coworkers. Keiko, who has a history of strange impulses—wanting to grill and eat a dead bird, pulling down a hysterical teacher's pants to get her to be quiet—applied to work at the Hiromachi Station Smile Mart on a whim. Where someone else might find the expected behavior for convenience store workers arbitrary and strict, Keiko thrives under such clear direction, finally finding a way to be normal. In fact, she thinks of herself as two Keikos: her real self, who has existed

since she was born, and "convenience-store-worker-me." But normalcy is not static, as Keiko discovers. The older she gets, and the further she drifts from milestones like having a "real" job, marrying, and having children, the more her friends and family push her towards change. She strikes a sham marriage deal with a lazy and shifty ex-coworker, which, though it finally makes her "normal" in the eyes of others, throws her entire life and psyche into turmoil. Murata's smart and sly novel, her English-language debut, is a critique of the expectations and restrictions placed on single women in their 30s. This is a moving, funny, and unsettling story about how to be a "functioning adult" in today's world."-Publishers Weekly

Should the weather not be favorable for an outdoor performance, we will hold the concert in the Reading Room.

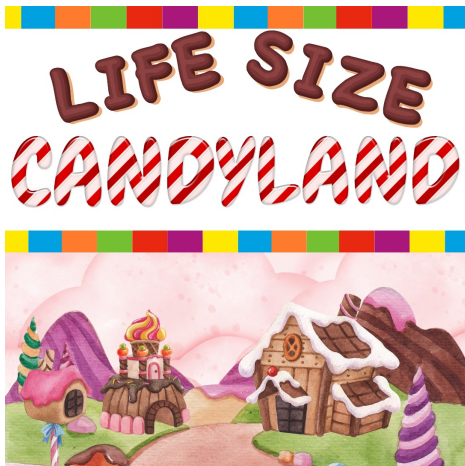




### Ukulele Group - July 9

### Die Well Death Education - July 28

Join us at Kennebunk Free Library on **Monday, July 28 from 6 to 7:30 p.m.** for the twelfth session in the Die Well Death Education Series with host Leona Oceania. You are welcome to attend one or all of the sessions - no registration is required.

**In Session Twelve, we will discuss the film: 'Flight from Death: The Quest for Immortality'**

Narrated by Gabriel Byrne, this seven-time Best Documentary award winning film is the most comprehensive and mind-blowing investigation of humankind's relationship with death ever captured on film. *Flight from Death* uncovers death anxiety as a possible root cause of many of our behaviors on a psychological, spiritual, and cultural level. Following the work of the late

cultural anthropologist Ernest Becker and his Pulitzer Prize-winning book *Denial of Death*, this documentary explores the ongoing research of a group of social psychologists that may forever change the way we look at ourselves and the world. Over the last twenty-five years, this team of researchers has conducted over 300 laboratory studies, which substantiate Becker's claim that death anxiety is a primary motivator of human behavior, specifically aggression and violence. 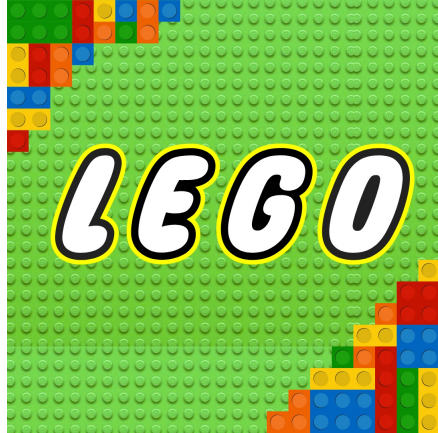

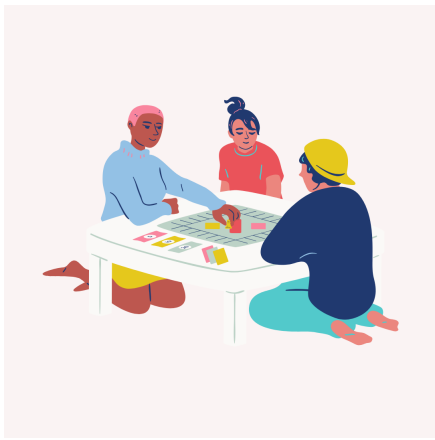
### Demigod Days: Sun and Moon - July 8

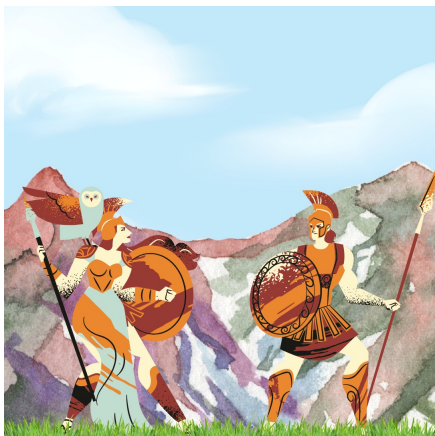
## Dungeons and Dragons - July 7, 14, & 28

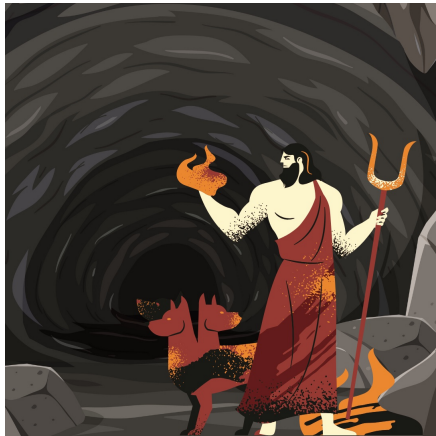


### 39 Clues Amazing Race - July 17

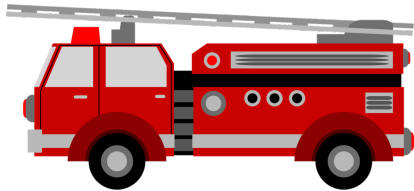

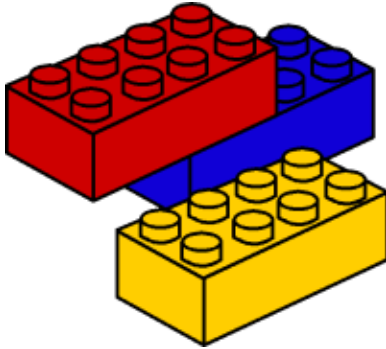

*Orbital* by Samantha Harvey



This novel won the 2024 Booker Prize. Reviews refer to it as science fiction, literary fiction and philosophical drama and it is all of these. I listened to it is a meditation on space travel that this earth-bound reader will never experience. It is beautiful, reverent and peaceful. It is also practical. In space when you wake up you check on your arms and legs because gravity is not telling you where they are. In space when you drop something you have to overcome looking down because it could be anywhere... probably not down. A gem of a book, short and sweet and very different.

There is a modern simultaneous story of Emsley Wilson, part owner of an auction houses in New York City and the west coast. This part of the book was fluff and romance and I really enjoyed the two stories as they unfolded. There are many strong female characters, and the story lines kept me engaged. This could be your beach read in July!

Can clothing manufacturers pay a living wage to skilled workers? I too recommend this book as a must-read.
