Teen Henna Workshop — Wednesday, July 20th 1-3 PM Mehndi, or henna tattoos, are skin designs traditionally used in India and Middle Eastern countries for ceremonial occasions such as weddings and festivals. Henna tattoos are made with henna paste and are completely natural and non-permanent. The paste contains only natural henna, 100% essential oils, lemon juice, and sugar. Genevieve Levin, from Remarkable Blackbird Studios, is the henna artist creating and applying the henna designs. Ms. Levin is Certified with the International Certification for Natural Henna Arts. All supplies needed to make the henna designs are provided free of charge.

Paper Mache Greek Vases — Tuesday, July 12th at 2 PM AND Tuesday, July 19th at 2 PM The ancient Greeks were master potters and used a vase painting style called "black figure technique." We'll use this method to make paper-mache vases fashioned after the ancient Greek pottery design. This is a two part workshop, as paper mache must dry before applying paint. All supplies needed to make the vases are provided free of charge.



Anime Club — Meets the first Thursday of the month at 1 PM: Thursday, July 7th and Thursday, August 4th Anime is the Japanese word for animation. It's characterized by highly stylized art similar to manga. Anime Club includes practice drawing in the anime style, Asian inspired crafts, and manga and anime film discussion. KFL's Anime Club receives free monthly anime DVD's from Operation Anime, which are viewed and critiqued at each meeting. No registration is required.

Gaming at the Library — Meets every Friday 3-4:45 PM

Gaming is a weekly gaming group for students in grades 6-12, which includes electronic games and fantasy board games. Gaming offers Wii Sports, Wii Sports Resort, Super Smash Brothers Brawl, and Rock Band 2. No registration is required.



On May 16th, KFL raised its overdue fines, a modest 5ϕ extra per book, audio or magazine (now 15ϕ per day); 10¢ extra per DVD/VHS (now 60¢ per day). MP3 Books Now at KFL

What is an MP3 CD?

An MP3 CD is a disc that contains compressed audio files. Because the files are compressed, more audio can fit on an MP3 CD than on a standard compact disc. The average audiobook is usually recorded on about eight compact discs. This same audiobook may be contained within one MP3 CD.

Where can I play an MP3 CD?

MP3 CDs are played in the same way as standard CDs. The difference is that special hardware or drives are needed to read them correctly. In computers the CD/DVD drive is already set to accept MP3 CDs. Newer home and automobile CD/DVD players also have the hardware needed to read MP3 CDs.

Why would patrons want MP3 CDs?

The average audiobook listener will love having only one disc to handle, rather than 8, 9, or 10! There's no need to switch discs while driving. They will have a more enjoyable listening experience and a much safer trip.
