On Thursday, June 28 at 2:00 p.m., Summer Reading Continues! Ben Fogg is the founder and creator of Ben & the




# Preventing Financial Exploitation - June 11 & 18



## **Tech Upgrades**

#### We're Encrypted!

You may notice when you visit our website that the URL bar reads now reads https: instead of http: There is also the addition of a small green lock with the word "Secure" to the left of this. What all of this means is that our site is now encrypted by a security protocol to help ensure user's data as well as the website data is protected. This is the same type of security protocol that you'll find with your banking and credit card websites.

#### Wi-Fi

When using your wireless devices at the Library you'll now see a splash page that will come up the first time you connect each visit. This is a legitimate addition to KFL and provides disclaimer information. We will also be tracking WiFi usage, but only numbers such as amount per day or what time of day our Wi-Fi is used the most. We never track user information such as names or content searched nor do we have the ability to.

#### Website

Our survey responses indicated that many of you would like to see an upgrade to our website - this change is now underway. Expect to see a new website in the upcoming months with a new design as well as responsiveness to your screen.
