#### Interruption in Minerva/MaineCat Requesting this Summer

Unfortunately, Minerva and MaineCat requesting will be unavailable for a while this summer. Interlibrary loans are transported between Maine libraries via a courier hired by the Maine State Library. The contract with the current vendor expires at the end of June and the new contract is an evolving situation. Because of this, we don't yet know when this interruption will begin or how long it will last. We will keep you updated regularly. As soon as we have information, we will pass it along.

You will still be able to use the Minerva catalog to request items from our collection, just not those from other libraries. The good news is that Maine Reciprocal Borrowing is still in place. If we do not have an item that you want, you can use your KFL card at any library on this list. Because we won't have transport, you would just need to pick it up and return it there. We also have reciprocal agreements with Graves Memorial Library in Kennebunkport and the Wells Public Library. If you live in Kennebunk or Arundel, you are able to get library cards there.

We will have purchase request forms at each circulation desk. If there's something you want that we don't have, feel free to fill one out. While we can't buy everything, it will help us decide what needs to be added. We'll also be looking into adding some additional titles to Libby.

I'm not going to sugar coat this - this is going to be frustrating and it could last for a few weeks to a few months as things get sorted out. We will do our best to help you find the materials that you need. Please be extra kind to staff, who will also be having a frustrating summer. If you have questions or concerns, please bring them to Michelle or to me.

I've scheduled two drop in information sessions: Thursday, June 13 at 2:00 and Monday, June 17 at 6:00. If you have questions or concerns, stop in. We'll have snacks and I'll share what I know. I'll be on vacation the first week of June, but otherwise, you are always welcome to stop by my desk (to chat about this or anything!) outside the Walker Room.




On Wednesday, June 5 at 6:00 Danny Gallant will be at Kennebunk Free Library to discuss what you can do to help

#### Michael Ambler of Restoration Laos - June 11

On Tuesday, June 11, 2024 at 6:00 p.m. Michael Ambler of Restoration Laos will be at Kennebunk Free Library to discuss the work his organization is doing to clear bombs from villages in Laos.



From 1965 to 1974, the United States waged a secret war in the tiny Southeast Asian nation of Laos. Laos is adjacent to Vietnam, where we were fighting in an effort to prevent Communist North Vietnam from taking over non-Communist South Vietnam. To try to cut North Vietnamese supply lines running through Laos, the U.S. secretly bombed the area. We dropped the equivalent of a planeload of bombs every eight minutes, 24 hours a day, for nine years. Most of the towns and villages of eastern Laos were destroyed, and a generation of children grew up in caves. Laos is the most heavily bombed country in history.

The war is not yet over for many people in rural Laos. About 30 percent of the bombs we dropped way back then didn't detonate at the time, and are deadly to this day. They still kill people, often children. They keep people living in fear. And they keep people poor, because they cannot safely use their own land to grow crops for sustenance and income.

Governments around the world, including the U.S. Government, support efforts to clear this half-century old scourge. But the work is too slow: many villages will wait years or decades more for a bomb clearance team to arrive.

Restoration Laos accelerates the pace by funding a bomb team that otherwise would not exist. We find and destroy lethal bombs in the most remote and poorest areas of Laos so that villagers can once again grow rice, go to school, and live with safety and dignity.

Come join Michael Ambler, the head of Restoration Laos, to learn more about the Secret War, the damaged yet beautiful nation of Laos, and the work of Restoration Laos.




### Ukulele Group - June 12 and 26

#### Die Well Death Education - June 24


Join us at Kennebunk Free Library on Monday, June 24, 2024 from 6:00 - 7:30 p.m. for the second session in the Die Well Death Education Series with host Leona Oceania. (This session was postponed from last month due to presenter illness.) You are welcome to attend one or all of the sessions - no registration is required.

Session two is a film. Barbara Karnes's *This is How People Die – Part One: Natural Process of Dying from Disease & Old Age* addresses the normal dying process, from months before

death through the actual moment of death. This film provides the knowledge and tools for working with the end of life, presented with non-medical terminology. It is a practical guide for working with anyone facing end-of-life issues. Part One will cover: role models for dying, dying being a normal and natural part of life, ways to die, dying development compared to infant development, dying dynamics, and 3-4 months before death on a continuum. Open discussion to follow.

Die Well Death Education is the passion project of Leona Oceania. Always fascinated with death and baffled by the fact that we don't talk about the one thing that is going to happen to all of us, she decided to do what she could to encourage that conversation. She has trained to become an End-of-Life Doula, a Home Funeral Guide, a Life Legacy Facilitator, and a Death Educator. She also serves on the board of the Funeral Consumers Alliance of Maine, is the facilitator of a number of Death Cafés in Southern Maine, and is a volunteer with a local hospice organization. She has built a bookcase coffin with the prodigious Chuck Lakin, which is currently in use as a bookcase in her living room until it is needed as a coffin.

#### Fiction Book Discussion - June 25



Briefly Gorgeous by Ocean Vuong.

"This first novel by poet Vuong (Night Sky with Exit Wounds, 2016) is narrated by Little Dog, a Vietnamese refugee who grew up in Hartford with his mother and his maternal grandmother, Lan. A writer now, he addresses his story as a letter to his mother, who cannot read, 'to tell you everything you'll never know.' He recalls her painful attempts to toughen him and his simultaneous rage for all that frays her—work, memories, difficulty communicating. At 14 he gets a job cutting tobacco, and there meets Trevor. Two years older, Trevor works to escape his alcoholic father and makes Little Dog feel 'seen—I who had seldom been seen by anyone.' Their covert love blooms brilliantly as Trevor, battling his own demons, handles Little Dog with bewildering warmth. This plot line is its own speeding train, while Little

Dog's letter also reveals the family's inextricable legacy from the Vietnam War. In Vuong's acrobatic storytelling, Lan's traumatic wartime tale unspools in a spiraling dive, and a portrait of Trevor emerges in the snapshots of a 10-page prose poem. Casting a truly literary spell, Vuong's tale of language and origin, beauty and the power of story, is an enrapturing first novel." -- (Booklist, vol 115, number 16, p21)



# SPEERS GALLERY



## June Artist: Randal Boyd

The Speers Gallery at the Kennebunk Free Library presents the exhibit "Seeking the Quiet Within" by L. Randal Boyd of Kennebunk. The exhibit runs June 3-28.

The two-dimensional works feature oil on canvas, mixed media, and several prints of personal observations. Randal expresses "This is my first 'one-man' show, and intentionally my last. As my life ebbs, naturally, I consider how I wish to be remembered – as an artist. Hopefully, viewers will see a work that engages their own memories and our shared emotions." Four of the nineteen works were completed prior to 1999, and the others since the fall of 2019. Since 2019 Randal has also painted an additional ten works privately owned and not on display. No work in his exhibit is for sale.

Randal said one main feature of his life are the many recurrent voices intoning these similar themes: "Why, you could have been in *this* profession; you could have done *this* with your life; you might have been well remembered had you become *this*. BUT (says I), I have been a veteran, a darkroom film developer, a tailored suit salesman, an air conditioner installer, a truck driver, land surveyor, a vice president of a government union, and an Engineering Instructor. And yet, after retiring with 38 years of service, from Portsmouth Naval Shipyard, I am happy to finally accept my own artistic 'gift' from my Grandmother, Clara Marie Sands Boyd, and as Bob Dylan said 'all the faces who brought me here'".

Kennebunk Free Library is pleased to showcase the work of this talented local artist.

The public is invited to view the exhibit in the library's Speers Gallery from June 3-28 at 112 Main St., Kennebunk, Maine during regular library hours when the gallery is not in use for library programs. My Name is Barbra by Barbra Streisand

Starting with the early death of her father, attention-deprived childhood, ugly duckling appearance and overcoming barriers by sheer grit and determination to finally being recognized as the true star talent she is. I highly recommend making the time commitment required by this long autobiography to anyone interested in hearing the details of her artistic genius in acting, singing, directing, script writing, fashion, and makeup. Her romances and professional relationships are shared for those that love "movie star" stories. Her research into her Jewish faith tradition and the Torah as she prepares to write scripts and music, act and sing, as well as direct Yentl is fascinating. Even if you do not finish it, this book is worthwhile. The audio version is read by the author, and it feels like you are sitting and having a chat with Barbra Streisand. Day Hiking New England by Jeffrey Romano

This is a new addition to KFL's Bolton Travel Library. It gives very useful information in the "Hikes in a Glance" section including location, length, difficulty, season availability, kid or dog friendly, beach combing, birds, flowers, waterfalls, geologic, historical, and if there is a fire tower.
