The KFL proudly hosts Jim Shepard of Portland, Tuskegee Airman, on Saturday, June 22 at 10 AM. As one of the last remaining Tuskegee Airman, Jim will speak about his experiences during World War II. Now 87, Jim served in Italy from 1943 to 1944 as Staff Sgt. and chief crew mechanic. As a member of the 332nd Squadron, he saw combat in Italy and crewed the P-39 Airacobra, the

Republic P-47 Thunderbolt, and the North American P-51 Mustang fighters until the war in Europe ended in 1945.

Summer Reading! Why is it so important?



Research has shown that kids who don't read over the summer start the school year behind their peers. As the school year progresses, these children don't catch up. By middle school, these children can be as far as two years behind their classmates.

One factor that contributes to the success of summer reading programs is the fact that children are reading for pleasure. There are no tests, no reports due. They can choose what they like, and develop the knack of "getting lost in a book." Public libraries encourage children to read for fun, and promote a lifelong love of reading.

Each summer, KFL offers incentives to keep children reading. Children earn prizes based upon their time spent reading. We encourage children to read magazines, comic books and graphic



novels, series books, and nonfiction books about subjects they like. Sports fans can get credit as they pore over statistics published in the sports pages of newspapers. Children who read music can count some of their time spent practicing their instrument-after all, musical notation is another written language! To help build home libraries, children who read at least 20 hours over the summer will earn a free book from the Friends of the Libraries.

To entice children, the library subscribes to ten children's magazines, from *American Girl*, to *Legos*, to *ZooBooks*. Our graphic novel collection includes *Garfield*, *Peanuts*, *Big Nate*, and *Bone*, Greek mythology, biographies, even an Action Bible. By reading for pleasure, kids keep their skills without even realizing it!

The Library offers free programming throughout the summer for readers of all ages. These programs begin the week of




