Cabin Fever Reliever

Kennebunk Free Library invites you to make a break from the winter blues at its annual **Cabin Fever Reliever** fundraiser, taking place **Saturday, March 4 from 6:00 to 8:30 p.m.** The Cabin Fever Reliever transforms the library into a midwinter oasis, complete with fine food from Kennebunk's own **Kitchen Chicks Catering**, live music from the **Kennebunk River Trio**, a **silent auction fundraiser**, and **"Pop-Up Relievers**," short workshops sure to educate, entertain, and do away with the winter doldrums.

Food and fun are on the agenda for this year's event. The evening's menu includes pulled pork sliders, meat and vegetarian chilies, classic mac and cheese, miniquesadillas, vegetable and cheese platters, guacamole and chips, and assorted desserts and coffee. The Kitchen Chicks will design a signature cocktail for the evening, and beer and wine will also be available for purchase. A s'mores station at the fireplace will give revelers a chance to get toasty warm and satisfy their sweet tooth.



Meanwhile, the "Pop-Up Reliever" sessions will give guests another opportunity to shake off the winter blues. Learn how to make **accordion journals** and **t-shirt necklaces** and test your puzzle-solving skills with a **mini escape room**. These events are free for all attendees. The silent auction provides the necessary supplies for getting through the last leg of winter. This year's items include wines from M.A.N. Family Wines, original artwork, an antique card catalogue, and other high-end items. Again this year each silent auction item will offer a "Frenzy Bid" - attendees who bid on the "frenzy line" for each item for entry into special raffle for other prizes.



Islam and America in a Turbulent World

Acclaimed author and University of New England professor Anouar Majid will shed light on the unexamined meaning of Islam in today's world and discuss how the United States should understand and deal with a powerful religion very few people truly understand during a presentation on **March 8 at 6 p.m.**

on very few March 8 at Morocco,

In this timely lecture, Majid, a native of Tangier, Morocco, and managing director of UNE's operations in Morocco, will

discuss the relationship between Islam and the West, Islam's place in the modern world, and how both Americans and Muslims can better understand each other. Majid has spoken frequently about the commonalities between Islam and the West, including an over-emphasis on orthodox beliefs and the importance of fostering conversations and embracing dissent.

Majid is the vice president for global affairs and communications at UNE and the founding director of the Center for Global Humanities and the Tangier Global Forum. The founding chair of UNE's Department of English, which he headed from 2000 to 2009, Majid conceived and established UNE's campus in Tangier.

An acclaimed author, he has published widely on the relationship between Islam and the West. He is the author of "Islam and America: Building a Future Without Prejudice;" "We Are All Moors: Ending Centuries of Crusades Against Muslims and Other Minorities;" and "A Call for Heresy: Why Dissent is Vital to Islam and America," among other works of nonfiction. Majid is also the author of the novel "Si Yussef," and his writing has also been published in Cultural Critique, Signs, The

Chronicle of Higher Education, the Washington Post, and other publications. Majid is also the editor of Tingis (tingismagazine.com), a free online magazine dedicated to a new reading of Islam and its traditions.

Healthy Recipes and Original Music

Author Marilynn Carter pairs simple, healthy recipes with original music composed by her husband, well-known jazz guitarist Steve Carter, in her first book, "No Fret Cooking." For Carter, food is one the many paths to health, and because of that, cooking should be as creative and stress-free as possible. She'll share recipes, cooking tips, and information on healthy eating on Tuesday, **March 7 at 6** p.m. Steve will join her to perform musical selections from the CDs included with the book.



A holistic health practitioner and lifelong cook, Marilynn Carter began writing "No Fret Cooking" in order to share simple, healthy recipes for everyone. The recipes are designed with room for cooks at home to use their own creativity and personality to craft delicious meals that use nutritious, local ingredients.

In a unique twist, Steve Carter composed, arranged, and performed 22 songs on two CDs that are included with "No Fret Cooking." "Music to Cook By" and "Music to Dine By" are designed to accompany Marilynn's recipes and include songs like "Hold the Bacon," "The Great Asparagus Caper," "Blueberry Blues," and "Chakra Juice." The food and music in "No Fret Cooking" are paired to make a culinary adventure that nurtures, tantalizes, and stimulates the mind, body, and spirit.

The presentation includes a slide show featuring recipes and cooking tips, as well as information about how to eat and cook based on the growing season. Guests are encouraged to bring questions about food and cooking for the Q&A following the presentation. Marilynn will also provide samples of foods prepared using recipes from the cookbook, while Steve will perform songs from the book. Signed copies of "No Fret Cooking" will be available for purchase.

Tax Help

It's income tax season again! This year, AARP Tax Help will be offered every Thursday from 9:30-12:00 through April 13. No registration is necessary. Appointments are first come, first served. Library doors will open at 9:30 sharp, with a sign-up sheet inside the library.

Make sure to bring all relevant documents, including a copy of last year's income tax return; W-2 Forms from each employer; unemployment compensation statement; SSA-1099 form if you were paid Social Security benefits; all 1099 forms showing interest and/or dividends and documents showing original purchase price of sold assets; 1099-MISC showing any miscellaneous income; 1099-R form if you received a pension or



annuity; all forms indicating federal income tax paid; dependent care provider information; all receipts or canceled checks if itemizing deductions; social security cards or other official documentation for yourself and all dependents; photo ID; check with printed bank information (if direct deposit of refund is requested); and health insurance coverage or exemption information.

Changing the Story, Fixing the Future:

Understanding the Stories that Perpetuate Inequality and Hold Us Back

Chuck Collins, author of the recently published *Born on Third Base*, will share his conviction that we can "Change the Story and Fix the Future" during a program co-sponsored by First Parish Unitarian Universalist Church and KFL on Friday, March 3 at 7:00.

Collins of the Institute for Policy Studies has spent two decades working to shift the national debate about wealth inequality and how it relates to racial divisions and taxation.

"We are living between two worlds," he says. "There is the world we have always known, but realize now has deep system flaws like extreme inequality, climate change, and global instability. And there is the future world, one that we can have a hand in shaping."



Collins was born into a family in the top percent of the wealth spectrum and inherited a fortune. He donated his wealth to several foundations, however, shifting himself into the 99 percent in order to do his part in effecting change. He joined with Bill Gates, Sr. in writing Wealth and Our Commonwealth: Why America Should Tax Accumulated Fortunes, and is coauthor with Mary Wright of The Moral Measure of the Economy about Christian ethics and economic life. His goal is to organize members of the one percent to advocate for fair tax policy, living wages, and campaign finance reform.
