Lawyers in Libraries at KFL - May 2

Lawyers across the state will spend time in local libraries during Law Week to provide resources and assistance to people in need, talk about statewide legal issues and meet with library patrons. *Lawyers in Libraries: Law Week 2018* is a free event that is open to the public. It will take place in libraries statewide during the first week in May.

This law week, we will host Thomas Schoening, Esq. of Drummond & Drummond, LLP. Schoening will be available for 10-minute private consultations from 5:30 to 7:30 on Wednesday, May 2, 2018. Schoening specializes in real estate, corporate, and employment law. For other matters, he can provide information about free resources, low-cost legal assistance and legal referrals. In Stitches meets every Tuesday mornings at 11am in the Walker Room. No registration is needed, just drop by for as long as you like.




Tech Time - May 4, 11, 18, & 24


