May Day Book Sale!

The Friends of the Kennebunk Free Library will have a book sale on Saturday, **May 3, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.** in conjunction with the Town of Kennebunk's May Day Festival.

The sale will be held in Hank's Room and outside (weather permitting), and feature current adult hardcover fiction for \$2, nonfiction and miscellaneous 5 for \$1, and paperbacks 10 for \$1. Children and young adult books are all 10 for \$1. Media items such

as DVDs, CDs and Audiobooks are 10 for \$1. Games and Puzzles are \$1.

Friends support the library by raising funds that help sponsor library programs and materials including passes to local museums and parks, summer reading programs, Kanopy streaming service, OverDrive e-content, and large print books.


The first Thursday of every month




Trivia Night - May 21

Fiction Book Discussion - May 27

Join us on **Tuesday, May 27 at 1 p.m.** to discuss *The Thursday Murder Club* by Richard Osman.



"British TV celebrity Osman mixes mirth and murder in his exceptional debut, a series launch featuring the four members of the Thursday Murder Club, residents of the Coopers Chase Retirement Village in Kent. Despite their different backgrounds, Elizabeth, Ibrahim, Joyce, and Ron share an interest in solving mysteries. When 26-year-old Donna De Freitas, a police constable who dreams of pursuing serial killers, visits the home to talk to the pensioners about "Practical Tips for Home Security," the club members arrange for Donna to be assigned to a homicide case they have a connection to by manipulating her boss, so that they can get access to the investigation through a grateful Donna. That way they can take a crack at solving the bludgeoning murder of drug dealer Tony Curran, who operated a building business as a front, and whose killer left a photo of three men, one of whom is Ron's son, near Curran's corpse. They use their individual talents, including Joyce's gift for gathering information unobtrusively, and Ibrahim's medical knowledge, which enables him

to narrow the timing of a second, related killing. Osman's witty prose (labor activist Ron's "picture was rarely in the papers without the caption 'Talks between the two sides collapsed late last night'") is a highlight. Fans of Lynne Truss's Constable Twitten mysteries will be tickled." - Publishers Weekly

In short, protecting consumers from unscrupulous selling practices in the funeral industry.


Beadcraft - May 7

May Artist: J. Hutchinson Fay

The Speers Gallery at the Kennebunk Free Library presents "Quintessential New England Landscapes and Architecture: This is New England" by J. Hutchinson Fay. **The exhibition runs May 1 through 31, with an opening reception on Saturday, May 10 from 2:30 to 4:30 p.m.** All are welcome.

J. Hutchinson Fay began oil painting at the age of 11 and honed his craft at the Acorn Gallery School of Art in Marblehead, MA. His paintings reflect the warm, real and imperfect buildings and homes of our New England coasts to rural inlands. From the perspective of the blue-collar worker, his work embodies the essence of familiar places and landscapes that are ever changing and often lost to time.

Hutchinson Fay feels that everyone should be able to afford to create and has opened his Biddeford studio, Art Factory Studio, to the public three days a week where he teaches the foundations of printing making and oil painting. He is also a member of the Marblehead Arts Association, the Lyme Art Association and the North Shore Arts Association.

Night of the Living Rez by Morgan Talty

This collection of twelve stories gives a view into the contemporary life of Panawahpskek (Penobscot) Nation through the voice of the narrator, David. Hauntingly real experiences have led to drug addiction and a desperate desire to get out of their circumstances. Some reviews mention this has elements of horror; I didn't see it like that. The generational effects are felt decades after trauma is over. Our indigenous community members are generously letting us in on what is going on with them. This is the October selection for the Adult Book Discussion at KFL. (Available as a book from KFL, large print from Minerva, audio from Libby)

Be Ready When the Luck Happens by Ina Garten

In her memoir, Ina Garten lets us in on the good and the difficult of her childhood, the early years with her husband filled with travel and adventure, her successful career in Washington, DC as a financial analyst, and the difficulties of being a woman in the man's world of the 1960s that almost led to the end of her marriage. Ina makes some very high-risk choices in her business and personal life, when coupled with very hard work has brought her to the amazing place in the world she holds. Often, I did find myself observing that she has accomplished all this from a place of great privilege. Regardless, she is an interesting woman who knows how to tell a great story.

Revenge of the Tipping Point overstories, superspreaders, and the rise of social engineering by Malcolm Gladwell (audio read by the author)

I waited a long time for the audio version to become available from Libby. It has been 25 years since the original Tipping Point was published. The author has been criticized over the years for drawing his conclusions from other people's data and reviewers seem to see some extra care in that area. I love his drilling down on topics of social contagion such as a simple prescription law that seems to have protected states from the opioid addiction crisis, college admissions and sports, why Miami is the center of Medicare fraud, and which TV show changed the US's

collective minds on gay marriage, among others. If you like getting into the nitty gritty of things, you will enjoy this book. (Available from KFL in print, Libby as audio)
